ABOUT US

HOPE2WATER is a heartfelt initiative founded by Peter and Sarah Davis, inspired by the severe water crisis they witnessed during their annual trips to Haiti since 2009. What began as efforts to serve—painting hospitals, supporting orphanages, and joining medical teams—deepened into a mission to address the life-threatening issue of contaminated water.

Through their work, they formed close bonds with the Haitian community, including Hyrouance Cadet, a hospital chaplain in Dessalines. Hyrouance's stories of loss due to unsafe water—tragedies faced by his own family and hundreds in his village—brought the crisis into sharp focus. Moved by this reality, Peter and Sarah committed to bringing hope and change to communities in need through the founding of **HOPE2WATER**.

MISSION



HOPE2WATER provides safe, clean drinking water to children, families, and communities, saving lives through philanthropy, advocacy, outreach, and tailored water solutions. By addressing the water crisis, HOPE2WATER also promotes equality, enabling women and girls to attend school and pursue opportunities instead of spending their days collecting water.

One well provides clean and safe drinking water to over 2000 people a day. Women and Children can stay in school instead of having to gather water on a daily basis for the family. Prevents the spread of water borne diseases that claim thousands of lives each year. Empowers the community to grow crops and sustain a healthy environment.

VISION

We are committed to advancing renewable, self-sustaining technologies to deliver custom water solutions for safe, healthy drinking water—empowering communities with the skills to achieve self-sufficiency and eradicate waterborne diseases entirely.

Fundraising Strategy

Goal: Raise \$200,000 for the purchase and installation of Life Pumps in target communities.

Awareness Campaigns

- Launch a digital storytelling campaign highlighting the impact of contaminated water and the life-changing potential of Life Pumps.
- Create and share video testimonials from communities currently benefiting from HOPE2WATER projects.
- Develop a "Clean Water Challenge" campaign to engage donors and encourage recurring contributions.

Community Engagement

- Host events, such as Golf Outing.
- Partner with schools and faith-based organizations to create grassroots fundraising initiatives.
- Establish a sponsorship program where donors can "adopt" a pump and receive updates on its installation and impact.

Corporate Partnerships

- Approach corporations for sponsorship opportunities and matching donation programs.
- Collaborate with local businesses to host fundraising events or contribute a percentage of sales.

Life Pump Procurement and Implementation

Goal: Install 20 "Life Pumps" in high-need communities within two years.

Site Assessment

- Identify and prioritize communities with the greatest need through collaboration with local leaders and NGOs.
- o Conduct water quality and aquifer assessments to ensure sustainability.

Installation

- Work with engineers and local labor to install Life Pumps in targeted communities.
- Ensure pumps are designed for durability and can handle the unique challenges of each location.



Community Training and Education


Goal: Empower communities with skills for self-sufficiency and long-term maintenance.

Technical Training

- Train local technicians to maintain and repair Life Pumps.
- Develop user-friendly manuals and provide ongoing support to technicians.

Health and Hygiene Education

- Conduct workshops to educate families about the importance of clean water and hygiene practices.
- Partner with schools to integrate water and sanitation education into their curricula.



Monitoring and Impact Assessment

Goal: Ensure long-term sustainability and measure the impact of Life Pumps.

Monitoring

- Set up a system for tracking pump performance and water quality.
- Conduct bi-annual visits to ensure pumps remain operational and effective.

Impact Assessment

- Measure improvements in community health, education attendance (especially for girls), and economic productivity.
- Share success stories with donors and stakeholders to maintain engagement and support.





Expansion and Advocacy

Goal: Expand HOPE2WATER's reach and advocate for global clean water solutions.

Scaling Projects

- Use data from completed projects to secure grants and expand operations to new regions.
- Explore renewable energy options, such as solar-powered pumps, for future initiatives.

Advocacy Efforts

- Partner with international organizations to advocate for clean water access as a basic human right.
- Promote the integration of clean water solutions into broader development programs.


HOW CAN YOU HELP?
